8.2 As a result of an ongoing sovereignty dispute regarding Morocco's occupation of the Western Sahara, importing phosphate from the Western Sahara is contentious and has attracted criticism and media attention globally.

New Zealand companies Ballance and Ravensdown source the majority of their phosphate from Western Sahara

As Ballance and Ravensdown provide the majority of the phosphate fertiliser used in New Zealand agriculture and horticulture, the issue is one that affects the whole of the national agricultural sector in New Zealand.

The companies are cooperatives with nearly all customers being cooperative members in order to receive quota. NZSF therefore has a small amount of equity exposure to Ballance through its farm cooperative membership.


NZSF's farm manager FarmRight uses phosphate supplied by Ballance on its farms. We are engaging with Ballance, OCP (the Moroccan-state owned company supplying Ballance) and other industry participants to understand more about the issue and to identify whether any commercially realistic alternatives are available to us.


NZSF also has a small amount of listed equity exposure in our global passive equity mandates to companies operating in the Western Sahara. We have not excluded these companies but have engaged with some of them in the past.



PHOSPHATE ROCK

U.S. mine production annual capacity was expected to remain at 32.6 million tons for the next several years, because any new mines that are planned to open in Florida and Idaho would be replacements for existing mines. World mine production capacity, excluding China, was projected to increase to 168 million tons in 2021 from 147 million tons in 2017, according to industry analysts. The bulk of capacity increases will take place in Egypt, Jordan, Morocco, Senegal, and Turkey. Phosphate rock production in China was estimated by industry analysts to be around 85 million tons, which is considerably lower than the official data published by the Government of China.

In 2017, a new phosphate rock mine and fertilizer facility began operation in Saudi Arabia, which increased production capacity in the country to 10.5 million tons per year from 5.0 million tons per year. The leading United States integrated phosphate producer has a 25% stake in the associated DAP facility with two companies from Saudi Arabia. World consumption of P_2O_5 , contained in fertilizers and other uses, was projected to increase to 48.8 million tons in 2021 from 45.7 million tons in 2017. Asia and South America would account for about 70% of the projected growth.

<u>World Mine Production and Reserves</u>: Reserves for Brazil, Egypt, Finland, Israel, Jordan, Peru, Saudi Arabia, and the United States were revised based on information from individual company reports. Data for China and Russia were revised based on information from Government sources.

<u>World Resources</u>: Some world reserves were reported only in terms of ore tonnage and grade. Phosphate rock resources occur principally as sedimentary marine phosphorites. The largest sedimentary deposits are found in northern Africa, China, the Middle East, and the United States. Significant igneous occurrences are found in Brazil, Canada, Finland, Russia, and South Africa. Large phosphate resources have been identified on the continental shelves and on seamounts in the Atlantic Ocean and the Pacific Ocean. World resources of phosphate rock are more than 300 billion tons. There are no imminent shortages of phosphate rock.

Substitutes: There are no substitutes for phosphorus in agriculture.
