

Independent Limited Assurance Report to the Directors of the Guardians of New Zealand Superannuation

Conclusion

Our limited assurance conclusion has been formed on the basis of the matters outlined in this report.

Based on our limited assurance engagement, which is not a reasonable assurance engagement or an audit, nothing has come to our attention that would lead us to believe that the 2022 Carbon Footprint (Emissions Intensity and Fossil Fuel Reserves) presented in Table 1 and Carbon Intensity and Fossil Fuel Reserves Reductions relative to 2019 presented in Table 2 of the Carbon Footprint Report 2022 for the period 1 July 2021 to 30 June 2022 (the 'subject matter') has not, in all material respects, been prepared in accordance with the requirements of Guardians of New Zealand Superannuation management criteria (the "Criteria").

Information subject to assurance

We have performed an engagement to provide limited assurance in relation to Guardians of New Zealand Superannuation's ("GNZS'") 2022 Carbon Footprint (Emissions Intensity and Fossil Fuel Reserves) presented in Table 1 and Carbon Intensity and Fossil Fuel Reserves Reductions relative to 2019 presented in Table 2 of the Carbon Footprint Report 2022 for the period 1 July 2021 to 30 June 2022

Criteria

The subject matter was prepared in accordance with the Criteria specified in 'Box 2: The Fund's Approach to Carbon Footprinting' contained within the Carbon Footprint Report 2022. As a result, this report may not be suitable for another purpose.

Standards we followed

We conducted our limited assurance engagement in accordance with International Standard on Assurance Engagements (New Zealand) 3000 (Revised) *Assurance Engagements other than audits or reviews of historical financial information* and International Standard on Assurance Engagements (New Zealand) 3410 *Assurance Engagements on Greenhouse Gas Statements* ("ISAE (NZ) 3410"). We believe that the evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our conclusion. In accordance with those standards we have:

- used our professional judgement to plan and perform the engagement to obtain limited assurance that the subject matter is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error;
- considered relevant internal controls when designing our assurance procedures, however we do not express a conclusion on the effectiveness of these controls; and
- ensured that the engagement team possess the appropriate knowledge, skills and professional competencies.

The procedures performed in a limited assurance engagement vary in nature and timing from and are less in extent than for a reasonable assurance engagement. Consequently, the level of assurance obtained in a limited assurance engagement is substantially lower than the assurance that would have been obtained had a reasonable assurance engagement been performed.

Our report should not be regarded as suitable to be used or relied on by any party's other than GNZS for any purpose or in any context. Any party other than GNZS who obtains access to our report or a copy thereof and chooses to rely on our report (or any part thereof) will do so at its own risk.

To the fullest extent permitted by law, we accept or assume no responsibility and deny any liability to any party other than GNZS for our work, for this independent limited assurance report, or for the conclusions we have reached.

Our report is released to GNZS on the basis that it shall not be copied, referred to or disclosed, in whole (save for GNZS own internal purposes) or in part, without our prior written consent.

Management's responsibility for the Carbon Footprint Report

Management of GNZS are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the subject matter in accordance with the Criteria. This responsibility includes such internal control as Management determine is necessary to enable the preparation of a subject matter that is free from material misstatement whether due to fraud or error.
